Opening Prayer: Psalm 40:1-4a NIV

Scripture Reading and Reflection: Luke 9:43-48 & 51-56

- **Reading:** What does the text say that everyone should understand?
- **Contemplation:** Placing yourself in the text – what does it stir up in you?
- **Action:** What do I need to remember and act on from this text?

Refrain:
